Belle Helene:

The reading of *Belle Helene* has been set for Sunday, September 22, 20119, at 3:00 pm, at the Orion Associates West Building. The Fall Cabaret:

There will be a Ruddigore promotional cabaret, as there was for The Mikado, on the weekend of February 28, 29 and March 1, 2020. Anna would like to do a poll of the cabaret singers asking them if they enjoy doing them and if they think the cabarets should continue, as well as what kind of repertoire they should consider doing.

Ruddigore:

Auditions are scheduled for Saturday, November 2 and Sunday, November 3, 2019. Call Backs are scheduled for Monday, November 4, 2019.
