FLUTE INSTRUCTORS AT A MAJOR UNIVERSITY.

FROM 1947 UNTIL HIS UNTIMELY DEATH FROM CANCER, HE TAUGHT AND PERFORMED AT THE UNIVERSITY OF MICHICAN. OVER THE YEARS, HE BECAME A FULL PROFESSOR, SERVED AS ASSOCIATE DEAN OF THE GRADUATE MUSIC SCHOOL AND STILL FOUND THE TO FOUND THE UNIVERSITY'S BAROOUE TRIO AND WOOD WIND QUINTET.

IN MEMORY OF MR. HAUENSTEIN'S COMMITTMENT TO MUSIC AND THE PERPETUATION OF MUSIC, WE HAVE DEDICATED THIS SERIES: THE "NELSON M. HAUENSTEIN CONCERT SERIES".
